



**Jaipur IPA - Thornbridge Hall Country House Brewery;** Derbyshire, United Kingdom - IPA is one of the most famous stories in brewing history. In England, pale ales grew popular, but their low alcohol levels made them risky to ship over long sea voyages. IPA, or India pale ale, was created as a modification that takes advantage of hops preservative properties while bringing more hop flavor to the forefront. Look for lemon, citrus, grass, spice, and pine flavors.

**Hanssens Gueuze - Hanssens Artisanaal;** Dworp, Belgium - Another incredibly old method of brewing is to allow wild yeast to start your fermentation for you. This method is still practiced in the Sienne valley in Belgium, where beers known as lambics are left out to the elements after brewing. Wild fermentation creates many more flavors than a controlled brewers yeast, and creates acids and additional flavor compounds in along with alcohol. Look for flavors of wine, vinegar, fruit, cheese, and horseblanket.
