## Fabián 14° Dark Bohemian Lager

6% alc./vol.

Dark lager- Rich, good amount of malts with a hint of sweetness ==> It is simply a completely different world + interpretation of classic /historic styles: So different from "German Dunkles" .... You need to taste & experience it: The dryness/bitterness in the finish, the malt sweetness on the palate, the different aroma. but not aggressively so.







## Fabián 13° "Fresh Hop Special"

Bottom fermented light colored beer 13% of plato 5,51 % alc/vol 54,1 EBU bitterness Malts: Czech malt, Vienna malt, Caramalt Fresh Czech SAAZ hops directly from the field.

A gold colored stronger lager brewed at the end of August with fresh green hop from the new season.

Again, nothing like this in our portfolio.

The malt/grain character is so different from "German style brewing": "grainy", not sweet, with a long dry-bitter finish
